Exteriors : The entire temple is devoid of decoration, except the

dopichhasimhas over the beki of the vimana to support the amalaka and udyotasimha in all raha pagas of both the vimana and jagamohana. The bada of the jagamohana is decorated with pidhamundi design.

Interiors : Decorated with stucco figures like – amorous couple,

erotics, and various divinities which have been

pigmented.
