Present : Living temple, the presiding deity is an eight-armed

goddess Chamunda, locally known as Charchika. She is seated on a prostrate human body and wearing a garland of human skulls. She displays *khadga*, *shula*, *katari* and *varadamudra* in her four right hands whereas the four left hands represent severed head, blood-cup, *damru* and leaving a finger of the remaining

hand soaked in blood.

except dopichhasimhas over the beki and projecting lion on each raha of the gandi. The wooden ceiling of the mandpa is relieved with episodes from Bhagabata Purana with intervening decoration of animals and birds like - elephant, duck, parrot, peacock, etc; floral motifs, lotus medallions, scroll and jali works, animal hunting, horse rider, gaja-vidalas, makaramukha, mithuna and maithuna images. The paintings with matching colours over the carvings add glamour to the entire composition. Besides, the parsvadevata niches Chamunda. enshrine four-armed four-armed Durga and an Mahisasuramardini eight-armed Chamunda on the north, west and southern side

respectively.
