Ornamentation

Exteriors : The kanika pagas are decorated with elongated

khakharamundis so far as the jangha is concerned in the lower part Vyalas and upper part nayikas of different proportions are carved. In the central tier of jagamohana divine figures are noticed. Balustrade windows are noticed in bada portion of the vimana. The raha pagas are decorated with a series of pilasters. Different stories relating to Krisna are depicted in the Upara jangha of jagamohana, natamandapa and bhogamandapa in the

outer wall.

natamandapa and bhogamandapa are of pidha order.
